

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Preface

《大学英语教学指南》(2020版)指出"教材是传播新知识、新思想、新观念的重要载体, 是教学内容的主要载体,也是实现教学目标的基本保证。大学英语教材编写的指导思想应体 现新时代、新要求,体现党和国家对教育的基本要求,服务高等教育教学改革和人才培养, 应体现人类文化知识积累和创新成果。"随着全球化的深入发展,我国对外开放的不断深化, 英语作为国际通用语言的重要性愈发凸显。为了适应这一时代需求,我们特别编写了《新思 大学英语》系列教材,旨在提升学生的外语综合运用能力、跨文化交际能力、思辨能力、前 瞻思维、家国情怀、国际视野和学习能力,为学生的全人发展奠定坚实的基础。

本系列教材顺应新时代发展步伐,内容新颖,难度适合,符合学生发展需求,践行立德 树人根本任务,有机融入课程思政元素,自觉坚定文化自信。它既符合当代教学要求又贴近 学生实际需求,并具有如下鲜明特色:

1. 体现整体性和层次性, 循序渐进

在编写本系列教材过程中,我们注重结构体系编排科学合理,每单元内容的整体性和连 贯性,确保每个单元围绕同一主题展开,各个环节紧密相连,形成有机整体。基于对大学生 英语水平和高校英语教学现状进行开发,充分考虑基础教育阶段和高等教育阶段英语教学的 衔接,各分册、各单元、各板块内容相互关联,环环相扣,难度、挑战度设计合理、科学, 具有良好的递进性和层次性,符合学生的认知发展规律。

2. 体现价值引领和时代气息,有机融合工具性和人文性

本系列教材以人与自我、人与自然、人与社会的关系为主线,在选材方面具有鲜明的思想性、经典性、时代性、趣味性和发展性,自觉融入社会主义核心价值观和中华优秀传统文化,体现中国特色、中国风格,同时积极反映世界科技新进展,吸收人类文明优秀成果,体现多元文化和对比文化的国际视野。以单元主题为线索,题材和体裁丰富多样,采用多技能大纲模式,发展学生的英语听、说、读、写、译等语言技能和外语综合应用能力,培养他们的语言感知能力和语言鉴赏能力。引导学生深入阅读、思考和讨论,树立正确的世界观、人生观和价值观,提升跨文化意识、批判性思维和创造性思维,为成为具有前瞻思维、国际眼光的人才提供有力支撑。

3. 突出"以生为本""体验式学习"的思想

本系列教材立足我国当代大学英语教学的发展特点,充分考虑学生的学习特点和需求, 注重教材的实用性和趣味性,强调以学生为中心,以活动为导向,基于问题链设计练习形式, 以面向真实世界的任务和项目为驱动,融语言学习于真实的活动之中,学练结合,让学生在

互动中相互学习、共同进步。通过教授学习策略和方法,拓展学生的学习资源和渠道,培养 自主学习能力和终身学习意识,激发学习兴趣,提高学习效率。

4. 提供丰富的立体化配套教学资源

为积极推进二十大提出的"教育数字化",本系列教材配有完备的立体化教学支持系统, 充分利用各种信息技术手段提升学生的学习效率和教师的教学效果。借助网络自主学习平台、 新思课堂、教学资源库、多媒体学习软件等,实现服务立体化,方便师生进行线上线下、课 内课外相融合的教学和学习,满足数字原住民的学习需求。

本书为《新思大学英语综合教程1》, 共包括8个单元, 分别为Hello! New World!; Mom, Tom and Maugham; Jam, Jump and Joy; Rich Dad Poor Dad; Footprints Without Feet; Manners Matter; Keen on Green 和 My Chinese Dream。每单元的内容探讨和语言训练围绕同 一主题展开,设计了听、说、读、写、译、项目实践等板块, 具体包括:

Learning Objectives 提供清晰具体的学习目标,帮助学生明确学习重点,便于进行自我 评价,从而及时调整学习策略,提高学习效果。

Be a Good Listener 通过情境自然、真实地道的音频材料,训练学生的听力能力,包括 对话、新闻报道、短文等形式。设置与大学英语听力考试相契合的练习形式,为学生提供有 价值的实践训练。根据不同的学习内容,加入有关听力方面的学习策略指导,帮助学生提高 听力水平。

Be a Good Speaker 对话实例为学生提供一定场景下的交际活动框架和素材,培养学生 跨文化交际能力。口语实践通过引导性框架,使学生进一步拓展对话内容,提高他们的口语 表达能力。

Be a Good Reader 包括 Text A 和 Text B 两篇阅读。文章选材地道,体裁多样,主题丰富, 既符合当代大学生的认知和兴趣点,又能满足他们思想、情感、学习等多维度的需求。配以 阅读理解练习、词汇练习和开放式问题,提升学生的理解能力和思辨能力。同时,依据学习 内容,给出阅读方面的学习策略指导,帮助学生更有效地开展阅读学习。

Language in Use 包括对两篇阅读中出现的词汇、短语、重点句型等的练习和运用,帮助学生掌握核心词汇、语法、句法等基础知识,并通过拓展词汇和翻译练习提升他们的语言运用能力。

Be a Good Writer 包括指导性写作和应用写作。指导性写作将学生置身于段落的语篇之中,感受语篇的逻辑性,以任务的方式引导学生完成写作。应用写作则侧重培养学生应用文

的写作能力,包括书信、倡议书、图表等常见应用文的写作方法和技巧。

Do You Know 为实现"立德树人"根本目标,选取与单元话题相关的文章,侧重文化背景与文化差异,践行"深化文明交流互鉴,推动中华文化更好走向世界",培养学生对中国文化的理解和阐释能力,增强他们的跨文化意识和跨文化交际能力。通过了解不同文化背景下的思想观念、价值观念和行为规范,学生可以形成开放包容的文化心态,更好适应全球化时代的挑战和机遇。

Project 基于单元话题设置项目活动,形式包括调研、讨论、口头报告、演讲或辩论等, 培养学生创新思维、调查研究能力和沟通合作意识。通过参与这些项目活动,学生可以将所 学知识应用于实际情境中,提高他们的实践能力和核心素养。

Informational Listening

Informational listening is listening with the goal of learning, understanding, and grasping information. Let's take a look at a few skills that help with informational listening.

1. Concentration

When doing listening exercises, the most taboo is to focus on two tasks at once, so it is best not to do other things while listening. Choose a method that suits you to help focus, such as blinking, sitting straight, etc., but never keep staring at a single point on the test paper.

2. Refraining from Judgment

This skill requires an open mind. If we begin judging and jumping to conclusions when attempting to properly listen and retain information, our mind will wander and possibly miss valuable pieces of information.

3. Organization

This means identifying key concepts from auditory information and mentally organizing them into an outline so that you can better understand and remember materials.

Tip:


A news report normally includes six elements, the so-called "five Ws" and "one H": when (time of the news), where (place of the news), who (people involved in the news), what (news event), why (reasons for the news event), how (background, development and followup of the news event). While listening to a news report, pay special attention to the six elements and take notes.

A news report normally is organized in an inverted pyramid structure, also known as flashback, which arranges the full text according to the importance of the facts. The pyramid structure places the most important fact in the first sentence of the full text, namely the news lead. You need to catch the news lead to have a general picture of the news.



Text B

Embarking on Your Journey

- Para. 1 Starting college is one of the most exciting times in a young adult's life. It is a time of unprecedented freedom and excitement. It begins a new chapter of your life where you make your own choices and take full responsibility for yourself and your behaviour. No one is there to remind you to eat and get enough sleep or wake up in time for class. You are in control.
- Para. 2 Freshman year can be amazing and full of wonderful new experiences. It can also be lonely and overwhelming. The new pressures to manage your own space, deal with roommates, effectively manage time, get good grades, and take care of everything else that comes along, can take a toll. When not managed properly, these new pressures can lead to anxiety, stress, and even depression.
- Para. 3 In the first year of college, everything is new. You are at a new school, may have a new "home", and people are unfamiliar. The structure of classes is new. The level of responsibility and lack of accountability can be disarming for freshmen who are used to teachers who know them well and know when they have missed an assignment. There are all kinds of new things to adjust to. It can be lonely and overwhelming when college begins. Homesickness is not uncommon.

Para. 4 It may seem counter-intuitive, but getting involved in a study group or a team activity can be the best remedy for all the unfamiliarity. Since new students are all in it together, you will find that bonds are formed quickly and before you know it, you will have a "home" away from home. Having a weekly dinner with a roommate or classmate can also help give you something to look forward to and make you feel less lonely. Finally, getting together with anyone you might know from home can keep you feeling connected to your roots as you get established in your new place. It may take a semester to get used to the format of college. Make sure to discuss your challenges with professors or visit an academic advisor if you are struggling.

Be a Good Reader

- Para. 5 It can be tempting to stay up all night and sleep in late on the days you don't have any classes. Many freshmen sleep too much and overeat during the first year away. The wide open days can be difficult if you have not yet made friends and it may seem that sleeping and eating break up the monotony of studying and going to class.
- Para. 6 Try to set a schedule for yourself. Getting to bed at relatively the same time each evening and getting up at a reasonable hour in the morning will help you feel less like you are lost in an endless stream of days. Make sure to set aside time to study. If you need to break up the day, head to the library or a cafe to study, or go out for a walk. Additionally, eating three regular meals a day instead of snacking and eating at random hours will help avoid the dreaded freshman weight gain which can cause added anxiety.
- Para. 7 Now more than any time in the past, university students are dealing with anxiety, stress, and depression. There are many theories about why young adults are struggling with more mental health issues now than in years past. It is difficult to pinpoint, but many of the factors noted above can contribute to these challenges.
- Para. 8 There are a number of things that you can do to help with stress and anxiety: get adequate sleep, eat well-balanced meals, avoid junk food and alcohol, and get regular exercise, for starters. You can also practice relaxation techniques like yoga and meditation. If your emotions are still too much to manage, remember, many campuses have mental health clinics. Additionally, there are often **peer support** groups you can join if you are struggling with stress and anxiety. If you think you may be depressed or if you feel hopeless, it is very important that you let your family know and see a professional as soon as possible.
- Para. 9 For many young people, college is the first taste of adulthood. It is not uncommon to experience the **freshman blues**. A bit of self-care and practical coping strategies can make this transition much easier.







Yuelu Academy

Yuelu Academy was among the four ancient Chinese academies along with Bailudong Academy on Lushan Mountain of Jiangxi Province, Yingtianfu Academy in Shangqiu of Henan Province and Songyang Academy in Kaifeng of Henan Province. Yuelu Academy was built by Zhu Dong, the governor of Tanzhou (presently named Changsha), in the 9th year (976) of the Kaibao period of the Northern Song Dynasty (960-1127). Since the millennium, Yuelu Academy has produced a large number of talented people.

Yuelu Academy became Hunan University in 1926, and it was listed among the key cultural relics under China's state protection in 1988 owing to its perfect combination of natural scenery and man-made landscapes.

With an area of 21,000 square meters, Hunan Yuelu Academy nestles at the foot of Yuelu Mountain in an elegant style, where the architectural buildings are distributed along the central axis. The main buildings include lecture hall, imperial library and temple of literature, which embody the three functions of the academy's lecture, collection and sacrifice.

The academy taught the essence of Chinese culture, including Confucian classics, social etiquette, and calligraphic skills. While the desks, chairs and decor in the classroom retain the style of ancient China, teachers here have already begun to use modern teaching equipment when conducting classes. The strong affection between teachers and students is one of the cores of the academy's spirit.

Yuelu Academy, which focuses on teaching students in accordance with their aptitude, implements the tutorial system from undergraduate to doctoral students, combining the people-centred education of

traditional academies with the curriculumcentred education of modern universities.

While nourishing their own spiritual life with traditional culture, the teachers and students at the academy are striving to spread excellent traditional culture to the whole of society and make contributions to the revival of national culture.
